A Word from the Pastor Corey Fields

Outside my office, there is a small bulletin board that is now called "the pastor's corner." Here, I will share with you what I'm reading, interesting articles I've come across, and other things of interest.

One book you'll see on the board is one that I'm reading with colleagues in an online book group. It's called Slow Church, by C. Christopher Smith and John Pattison. It has produced some wonderful and challenging discussion among this group of my colleagues.

The name "Slow Church" is borrowed from a movement known as "slow food," which was started a few decades ago in response to the fast food culture and the fact that we have lost sight of the value in communities and families growing and eating food together.

Canadian journalist Carl Honore says that we have a "cult of speed." He writes, "Fast is busy, controlling, aggressive, hurried, analytical, stressed, superficial, impatient, active, quantity-over-quality. Slow is the opposite: calm, careful, receptive, still, intuitive, unhurried, patient, reflective, quality-over-quantity. It is about making real and meaningful connections – with people, culture, work, food, everything."

Smith and Pattison take this contrast and apply it to the church, saying that we too have been seduced by the "McDonaldization" of culture and encourage churches to approach ministry with the "slow" mindset as Honore describes it. "Many churches," they write, "particularly those driven by church growth models, come dangerously close to reducing Christianity to a commodity that can be packaged, marketed, and sold."

Good things often happen slowly, and one reason for that is because good things happen in community as we experience and cultivate "life abundant" together. I encourage us to see and want a church that honors the slow but meaningful growth that characterizes our discipleship and life together. I think the garden outside our church, now newly planted for the season, is a great visual symbol of this. As we grow food together – the slow, good, and tasty way – so may we be the church together.

Give or don't give. It is really your choice. But always look the person in the eye who is asking, and say "Hi" and then maybe add, "Sorry I can't help today" OR "Here you go." Always treat the person with respect...

...If you really want to help people who are housing deprived, then advocate for housing for all homeless people. Support organizations in your area that practice a "housing first" approach to homelessness. Also resist all efforts to dehumanize, disrespect, and criminalize people who are on the streets with laws like "No panhandling"...
