A Word from the pastor Corey Fields

I have never lived on a farm, so when it comes to the metaphors for "harvest" that we use around Thanksgiving time, I don't have direct experience. From what I can tell, harvest time for people who farm the land must be a long-awaited time that is both celebratory as well as a lot of hard work. It is both the end result of much work completed as well as more work to be done. The harvest represents both sustenance and blessing. Should we allow, it's also a reminder of what might not be and that there's no promise that it will turn out the same next year.

Factors like this are also in play when we as a church come together to celebrate the fruit of our labor in the past year and make our commitments for the next.

On November 5, you heard me say that GRATITUDE is a posture and a life-stance in which we treat nothing as deserved and everything as on loan. For me personally, when I combine this undeserving life-stance with a recognition of how much I've been given, it is humbling; even overwhelming.

This is Ingathering Sunday, when Calvary members are asked to make their pledge of support to the church for the coming year. Whenever we come to this time, I always hope you know that I do not ask anything of you that I don't do myself. Dayna and I, with gratitude, give of our time and our prayers, as well as a tithe (10%) of our income back to the church. Only you know what you and/or your family are able to do and how God is leading you to give to Calvary in 2018.

And only God knows the blessings and the opportunities that He has in store for us as we quickly approach another year. See you this Sunday, and don't forget that, as part of our celebration, we will share a Thanksgiving meal together after worship.

A Closer Look at Generosity and Stewardship


There are some people who would give you the shirt off their back if you asked them. They may have needs of their own but the needs of others are considered more important. So they give shirts, shoes, gloves, you name it, expecting nothing in return. Ever wonder what drives folks like this? They probably don't see themselves as generous, just as someone meeting the need of another. If we see ourselves as "one person meeting the need of another, using the means we have available" it just sounds, NORMAL. Who wouldn't do that?

Generosity includes free will giving of love, attention, tangible help and other resources. A blanket, a hug, a smile and more - if you have it to give and freely do so, you're being generous. During Sunday's service, we saw/heard many examples of brothers and sisters helping brothers and sisters, using whatever they have with the goal of spreading the message of God's love. It got me to thinking about the concept of The Giving Matrix (adapted). It goes something like this, we only have a limited amount of some things, but unlimited quantities of other things. Some things we have to earn while others are free. The matrix says anyone can be generous, even if your finances are tight, just focus on what you have to give and then share.... Check out the table below.

It's no coincidence that the longest list of items are both free and unlimited. It's easy to forget the importance of each item in the lower right box. Money is needed, but first it must be earned and, for most, supply is limited. Hugs, which are free, are needed, and supply is unlimited; you just have to be willing to open your arms and embrace someone. Our time is free to give, but we're limited to 24 hours in a day. Once we've acquired knowledge in a particular area, it can be shared with all who are willing to receive.

As we think about generosity and stewardship, let's seek to glorify God by looking for ways to *act* boldly with what we have to give!!




If you are interested in singing with the interfaith choir, they will rehearse at 6:30 beforehand. See Pastor Corey or Sarah Gober for the music.

Black Friday Thanksgiving Leftover Feast!


