#### A Word from the pastor Corey Fields

Last Sunday, I issued a challenge to consider. It is only that - something to consider - and I urge you to do what you feel God leads you to do. But here is my challenge.

You may remember that in the 2016 Advent season, I preached on "Advent Conspiracy." It's a movement with four tenets. It encourages Christians to (1) "worship fully," making the season a reverent celebration of what God did in Jesus; (2) "spend less" and (3) "give more," paring down one's spending on material things and focus on giving gifts that are meaningful and relational, like making things together or giving gifts that connect us personally; and finally, to (4) "love all" by taking the money they didn't spend on gifts and giving it to people truly in need.

One of the populations truly in need this year is Puerto Rico. The data is incomprehensible: Puerto Rico's actual death toll, estimated by media contact with funeral homes, is many times higher than the official count. Millions remain without water and electricity. According to one report, doctors are having to perform surgery with light from their cellphones and children are screaming from hunger.

That is why, this year, I'm going to conspire during Advent for Puerto Rico. My wife and I are not getting each other a Christmas gift and will instead donate to the rebuilding campaign of American Baptist Home Mission Societies. I am challenging you to consider if you are led to do this as well. We will be providing wooden blocks (symbolizing rebuilding) with a message about the project as something tangible that you can give to others explaining that a gift was given in their honor.

Sure, there are many other worthy causes and needs that could be the object of our Advent generosity, but I call out Puerto Rico this year because of their connection to our country and their dire situation. If you were to point out that this campaign will only be a very small piece of the puzzle, you would be right.

I am also mindful that we don't want to overshadow other giving opportunities like the Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering which we also receive in December, as well as many other causes we may support in our community. But I am hopeful that this falls into a different category by focusing on redirecting some of our Christmas spending.

Regardless, we will celebrate in this upcoming season that God came to us in a dark corner of the world, in lowly circumstances, and in a desperate situation. I believe He is still to be found there. I believe the church is called to be found there.

Please do not wrap your gift; mothers wrapping gifts for their own children will feel more ownership of what they are giving.
