It's been close to two months now since Hurricane Maria obliterated Puerto Rico.

You've heard about the homes that were leveled, the schools that were closed, the jobs that have been lost, and the churches that have been destroyed. That's not even considering the challenges still facing those who have no electricity and no safe drinking water. Life there is hard for so many, and recovery is not coming quickly.

Puerto Rico is STILL in dire need.

With your help, American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) has delivered to Puerto Rico 100 filters for purifying water, 1,000 solar lights, 125 solar chargers, 100 tarps, 200 portable triple burners for cooking and 50 propane tanks. Released from One Great Hour of Sharing, \$10,000 was used to purchase food.

And, still, Puerto Rico is in dire need.

Now Christmas is right around the corner. With the island in survival mode only, there's not much time or energy left for residents to think about a holiday.



As the world comes together on this Giving Tuesday to create community and share the bounty that many of enjoy in our lives, let us wrap our arms around the people of Puerto Rico in the generous spirit of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

"Rebuilding, Restoring, Renewing Puerto Rico" is ABHMS' multi-year initiative established to respond to the need Maria left behind. With your support, we will meet our goal of raising \$1 million dollars in the next six months to continue the work we have begun there.

Please give generously today to bring help and hope to our brothers and sisters in Christ in Puerto Rico, whose lives and livelihoods were torn asunder by the ferocious winds and waters of Hurricane Maria.


